Adverbs are words that tell when, where, or how.

Adverbs of time tell when.

## Example:

The train left yesterday.

**Yesterday** is an adverb of time. It tells when the train left. **Adverbs of place** tell where.

## Example:

The girl walked away.

Away is an adverb of place. It tells where the girl walked.

Adverbs of manner tell how.

## Example:

The boy walked quickly.

Quickly is an adverb of manner. It tells how the boy walked.
